Terms and Conditions

Access

We have a commitment to site-wide access – please see the attached leaflet from GAMA, our green access and mobility area.

Arrival

Please check in at the Campaigns Field Production Office (in the Campaigns field) as you arrive - please do NOT set-up before checking in. No arrivals before 8am Monday 27th July without prior arrangement.

Carers

We provide free tickets for the carers of those on the higher rate of Disability Living Allowance.

Children

Free entry for under-10s

Crew Swaps

We are looking at ways of enabling group members to leave and be replaced by arriving crew, please contact us nearer the time to check if this will be possible.

Day tickets

Day tickets are only available on Sunday and cost £30

Dogs

No dogs allowed for health and safety reasons. Dogs and their owners will be evicted without refund.

Equipment

Please ensure that the structures you bring are sturdy and waterproof. Please bring your own water containers.

Fires

No fires on the ground, there are some fire drums available on-site and communal fires

Getting on-site

Please unload in the car-park and use our horse-drawn or bike transport to get your equipment on-site.

Opening hours

We ask stalls to be open from 10am (2pm Weds) to 5pm daily

Pitch size

Standard pitch size is 5m x 5m, if you have a large crew or an on-site vehicle some of your crew may need to camp in the camping fields

Rubbish and recycling

Please don't bring anything (such as bulk leaflets, carpet or furniture) you are not prepared to take home again. Please recycle in your campsite and at your stall, we can provide bags.

Structures

Any changes to the type of structure you are bringing must be notified in advance. All structures must be up by noon Wednesday. Some structures are available for hire, please email us for details.

Supplies

We have a fairly priced vegan camp site shop stocking organic fruit and veg, bread, loo roll etc – please see our website (after March 09) for more details. Locally produced non - vegan foods are available from the food and farming area. Please bring what you need for 5 days or shop on-site.

Trading

If you wish to operate a shop or café you need to apply to our Markets Department through the BGG office. For your information our **Ethical Trading Policy** is:

- Reduced supermarket products – please buy wholesale from our local suppliers – see website for details after March 09
- No factory farmed products – any dairy or eggs must be free-range and organic
- No recognised products of gross exploitation – any bananas, coffee, cocoa, sugar and tea sold must be fair-trade
- Minimised packaging and no polystyrene
- No products from multi-nationals e.g. Nestle, Coke-Cola and Lucozade – see ethicalconsumer.org boycott list for more info
- No selling of bottled water – please provide drinking water for your customers
- We encourage the trading of goods that are second-hand / made from recycled materials / give a fair return to the maker
- Please allow customers to be served using their own plates and cups

Vehicles

If you wish to keep a vehicle with your stall you need to arrive by 8pm on Tuesday 28th July and remain static until 8am Monday 3rd August. We strongly discourage the removal and return of cars from and to car parks during the gathering and endeavour to provide for all your needs on site.

Water

The tap water on-site is safe for drinking but we are also planning to make spring water available (possibly for a donation) – please bring your own drinking water bottle.
